Program topics

Capital of Europe

Luxembourg is one of the founding members of the European Union. Numerous institutions such as the European Court of Justice, the European Court of Auditors, the Secretariat-General of the European Parliament and the European Investment Bank have their headquarters in Luxembourg, forming the third pillar of the EU alongside Brussels and Strasbourg.

Luxembourg as a financial centre

This is known worldwide and is ideal for excursions through the banking and financial sectors. 143 banks from all over the world have settled in Luxembourg, giving the city a multicultural flair.

Agriculture

In addition to traditional agriculture, viticulture in particular has been a widely practiced industry for centuries. The wine-growing region on the German-Luxembourg Moselle is known far beyond its borders, and wines such as Auxerrois, Pinot and Riesling have won numerous awards.

History and memorial tourism

Founded in 963, the city of Luxembourg and its surroundings are a region steeped in history. The Romans and Franks founded numerous cities and left their mark for eternity. There are also many sites and museums to visit on the subject of the Second World War and the Battle of the Bulge.

CURIA - Court of Justice of the European Union (Luxembourg-Kirchberg)

The Court of Justice of the European Union welcomes around 4,000 legal professionals to Luxembourg every year, including national judges and prosecutors, barristers, university professors and corporate lawyers. The visit programs enable these individuals to deepen their knowledge of the Court and its case law.

In addition, around 10,000 other visitors (mainly law students) visit the Court of Justice each year. The visits organized by the Seminars and Visits Unit are free of charge and are conducted in all the official languages of the European Union. Visits to the Court of Justice are only possible during the session periods.

EIB – European Investment Bank (Luxembourg-Kirchberg)

Visits last a maximum of one and a half hours. After a general presentation of the Bank's tasks and activities, visitors have the opportunity to ask questions. This is followed by a coffee break. Visits are free of charge and take place between Monday afternoon and Friday morning from 9.30 a.m. to 11 a.m. or from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., except on public holidays or non-working days.

ECA – The European Court of Auditors (Luxembourg-Kirchberg)

The European Court of Auditors welcomes groups of visitors who wish to learn more about its role and work.

Visits must be requested at least two months in advance, stating the reasons for the visit and the topics of particular interest to the visitors. For security and space reasons, the ECA cannot accommodate groups of more than 50 participants. Visitors must be at least 14 years old. During the visits, which last between one and one and a half hours, an ECA official will present the role and work of the institution, followed by an opportunity for discussion.

History

Luxembourg City History Museum - Lëtzebuerg City Museum

Since 5 May 2017, the city's history museum, recently renamed Lëtzebuerg City Museum, has been presenting its completely revamped permanent exhibition entitled 'The Luxembourg Story'.

The new exhibition offers both local and foreign visitors a compact introduction to the history of the city, with a selection of objects, films, photos and multimedia applications. The Luxembourg Story provides an initial overview of Luxembourg's history and at the same time gives locals the opportunity to discover the past and present of their city in detail.

Dräi Eechelen Museum (Luxembourg-Kirchberg)

The Dräi Eechelen Museum is housed in the restored redoubt of Fort Thüngen, an extraordinary historical building. The permanent exhibition illustrates a different era of the fortress and its influence on the country's history in each of the individual casemates. The tour begins in the Middle Ages with the capture of Luxembourg City by the Burgundians in 1443 and ends with the construction of the Adolphe Bridge in 1903. Over 600 objects, most of which have never been exhibited before, and original documents highlight the diversity of the collections. The historic museum building itself is an important element of the permanent exhibition. With its impressive underground galleries and mines, it still largely corresponds to its original state at the time of the last phase of expansion in 1836/37.

National Museum of History and Art (Luxembourg City Centre)

Located in the heart of the historic district of the old town, the National Museum of History and Art has recently been restructured and redesigned. Beneath the fish market, the archaeology galleries are now also accessible, with sections devoted to prehistory, early history, the Gallo-Roman period and the Middle Ages. The museum's permanent collection includes not only ancient sculptures and paintings, but also modern art collections of great originality. Since its reopening, the museum has also displayed works from the Grand Ducal Court's collection.

National Museum of Military History (Diekirch)

It has been 80 years since the Battle of the Bulge. We go in search of traces of an event that caused great devastation and suffering among the population in the north of the country in the winter of 1944. Using personal anecdotes from soldiers and civilians, the guide will shed light on one of the bloodiest battles of the Second World War. The tour is rounded off by one of the largest military collections in Europe and detailed, life-size dioramas.

Patton Museum (Ettelbrück)

The museum traces the most important events of the Second World War in Luxembourg and honours General George S. Patton Jr., commander of the 3rd US Army. In addition to the imposing statue (model) of General Patton, there are over 1,000 photographs and documents bearing witness to the German invasion in May 1940, the Nazi occupation and the liberation by American troops in September 1944.

The second part of the exhibition presents visitors with a considerable number of weapons and military equipment discovered in recent years on the battlefield in the Ardennes. Another part of the museum provides an overview of the air war in Luxembourg.

Fünfbrunnen Monastery (Troisvierges)

The Fünfbrunnen Monastery (known as 'Cinqfontaines' in French) has a rich and eventful history. Due to its historical significance, particularly for the Jewish community, the Luxembourg government acquired the monastery grounds to establish a memorial and educational centre there. The main themes are commemorating the victims of the Holocaust, raising awareness of anti-Semitism and racism, and promoting democracy and human rights.

The educational activities of the Cinqfontaines Centre focus on the following areas:

- Commemorating the victims of the Holocaust
- Providing information about the persecution of Jews in Luxembourg
- Raising awareness of anti-Semitism and racism
- Promoting democracy and human rights

The activities are offered by the Service national de la jeunesse (SNJ) and the Zentrum fir politesch Bildung (ZpB).

American Military Cemetery (Luxembourg-Hamm)

The American Military Cemetery in Hamm is the final resting place of US soldiers who lost their lives fighting against the German Wehrmacht during the Battle of the Bulge in 1944/45 at the end of the Second World War. General George S. Patton, commander of the Third US Army, was also buried here at his own request.

German Military Cemetery (Sandweiler)

A total of 10,913 German soldiers who lost their lives during the heavy fighting in the winter/spring of 1944/45 in the Luxembourg-Belgian and Luxembourg-German border area are buried in the German Military Cemetery in Sandweiler.

The German cemetery in Sandweiler belongs to the German War Graves Commission and stands in striking contrast to the nearby Luxembourgish-American cemetery in terms of design and layout.

Visiting both cemeteries is entirely feasible in terms of distance (less than 2 kilometres) and time required, and is highly recommended.
